# Three Rivers Walk To Emmaus

## Eighteen Years of Walking with Jesus

April 2010

### Where is your nail?

We have just finished an awesome Closing for Men's Walk #73. Fifteen men described their Mountaintop experience. As they filed in for the Closing, my thoughts went back to my experience on Walk #55.

I attended with a sense of apprehension. My moment of serious doubt occurred on our way to Candlelight. We were walking in the dark on a path dimly lit by candles. Out of the darkness came this soft wailing of bagpipes. Then, as we progressed along the trail, I could detect this faint chanting that increased in volume as we approached this building.

I had a flashback to my 1962 initiation into the Future Farmers of America (FFA) during my freshman year in High School in Mississippi. Our initiation was similar in that we were walked single file to the School Shop. There we were blind folded, entered the building one-at-a-time, ordered to do some unpleasant tasks, and then left the building. I vividly recall putting my hand into a bucket of what was described as fresh cow dung. It was really warm pudding. Somehow they were able to create the smell of fresh cow dung as I put my hand in the bucket. Having grown up on a farm, I was very familiar with that aroma. After that ceremony, I was a fully-fledged member of the FFA.

As the volume of chanting increased, I had visions of again being blind folded and undergoing some initiation ritual. What I found, after entering the building, was an overwhelming feeling of love as I saw several members of my Church holding candles and singing. I am reminded of that feeling whenever I hold the nail we received during miming. That nail goes with me everywhere.

Please come to Women's Candlelight this Saturday and share the love of Christ with the 26 Pilgrims on Walk #74. Let a Pilgrim from your Church know that she is loved. Give them a memory that they can hold onto during their Fourth Day. Do you have anything that reminds you of your Walk experience? Again, I ask,

"Where is your nail?"

### “What is Your Easter Moment?”

**John 20:14-16** <sup>14</sup>At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. <sup>15</sup>“Woman,” he said, “Why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?” Thinking he was the gardener, she said, “Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him.” <sup>16</sup>Jesus said to her, “Mary.” She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, “Rabboni!” (which means Teacher).

**John 20:26-28** <sup>26</sup>A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you!” <sup>27</sup>Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.” <sup>28</sup>Thomas said to him, “My Lord and my God!”

**Acts 9:3-5** <sup>3</sup>As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. <sup>4</sup>He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, “Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?” <sup>5</sup>“Who are you, Lord?” Saul asked. “I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,” he replied.

**Luke 24:15-16, 30-32** <sup>15</sup>As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; <sup>16</sup>but they were kept from recognizing him. <sup>30</sup>When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. <sup>31</sup>Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. <sup>32</sup>They asked each other, “Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?”

It was an Easter Moment for Mary, Thomas, Paul and Cleopus. It was an Easter moment for John Wesley at Altersgate when he felt his heart strangely warmed. Martin Luther and John Calvin each had Easter moments. What is an Easter Moment? My dear friend and reunion group partner, Rev. Bill Saxman, says an “Easter moment is when you meet the risen Christ, when you know within your heart of faith that “He is risen as He said.” Nothing can be the same for your eyes have been opened. Now you begin to see with the eyes of faith. Everything becomes focused around the resurrection.” It is for you when Jesus becomes real and personal. He lives not just in heaven, but is a part of your everyday life.

Did you have an Easter moment or two or three on your Emmaus weekend? Did you have an Easter moment Thursday evening as you meditated on the movie? Did you have an Easter moment when you heard the *Via de la Rosa* and *Does He Still Feel the Nails?* when the mimes presented you with a nail. Did you have an Easter moment during the Dying Moments Communion or when your table went to have prayer as you passed the cross among you? Did you have an Easter moment as you came through the doors Saturday night as the community greeted you by candlelight? Did you have an Easter moment as you read your agape Sunday afternoon? Did you have an Easter moment at Closing? Easter moments are what separate Christians from the rest of the world. In our Easter

moments, the risen Lord has called you and I to share God’s love with our world. As we were told at the Cross Ceremony, Christ is counting on us. Can I get a big Amen?

P.S. Our Community has not been spared the economic difficulties seen throughout our country. The past two Walks have seen a significant increase in scholarship applications. I am sure that our Board Treasurer, Janet Ruckel, would appreciate any green agape you might care to designate for the scholarship funds.

# AGAPE

Can you remember your walk and how you felt when you received agape for the first time? What a wonderful outpouring of unconditional love from members of the Emmaus Community. Now you have an opportunity to do the same for the upcoming Women's Walk.

Below are some guidelines that will help you and our Team members to create a wonderful experience of love for our Pilgrims:

1. Agape must be completed before bringing it to the camp. All the Team members are extremely busy and will need every minute to prepare for the Pilgrims.
2. Agape should be brought to the camp on Thursday night, if possible, but no later than Saturday evening before Candlelight. Please remember that bedtime Agape for Saturday will be distributed around 7:00 p.m. If there is any problem with getting your Agape to the camp, please contact: Flo Willaman, 6 Louis Court, Irwin, PA 15642 Phone: 724-744-0125 OR E-mail address: [floziejean@windstream.net](mailto:floziejean@windstream.net).
3. Agape can be made for the following situations:

#### **WOMEN'S WALK #74**

Pilgrims only	<u>30</u>
Pilgrims, Table Leaders and Assistants	<u>42</u>
Conference Room	<u>56</u>
Pilgrims and entire Team	<u>70</u>

**Note: Please try to add a few extra pieces for last minute additions.**

4. Please label each piece of agape with the following information:
  - Your reunion group's name.
  - Related scripture or a statement about the Agape (i.e., "Stick with Christ" on chewing gum).
5. Please label the "container," in which you deliver your agape to the Agape team, with the following:
  - How many "pieces" are in the container (so the team does not have to count it).
  - Say to whom the agape should be distributed (Pilgrims only, Team and Pilgrims, etc.). Understanding that if you do not provide enough Agape to satisfy your request, your Agape will be distributed accordingly.
  - When you would like it to be distributed, if you have a preference (i.e., bedtime Saturday, Conference Room, breakfast Dining Room, etc.)

Agape that was not used can be picked up on Sunday at the Walk's Closing. If you are not able to attend Closing, you can call Flo Willaman at any time to see if there were any pieces left over after the Walks.

#### **Agape letters for Sunday**

- If you are a Sponsor and are bringing letters for your Pilgrim, please make sure there are 12 letters bundled. These letters should be family and closest friends, etc. Remember, these are the letters they will read first. Each envelope should be marked on the lower left-hand corner with their relationship to the Pilgrim (i.e., "family" or "friend"). All other letters will be held and given to the Sponsor at Closing to give to the Pilgrim privately.
- If at all possible, please try to deliver letters before Candlelight on Saturday – if not sooner. It is helpful for the Agape team to be able to set up the Sunday Packets as early as possible.
- Please identify yourself as the Pilgrim's Sponsor when delivering the packets to the Agape team.
- Please remember there are to be **no gifts** for any member of the Walk, Pilgrims or Team. If you have something you would like to give, it should be done on the way home.
- Thank you to each of you in the Three Rivers Walk to Emmaus Community for showing the Pilgrims of Women's Walk #74 the love of Christ through your gifts of Agape.
