

# Three Rivers Walk To Emmaus

#### FROM THE LAY DIRECTOR:

"You can tell what they are by what they do." Matthew 7:16

This summer I participated in a small group study of *The Purpose Driven Life* by Rick Warren. I know that many of you have read this book and have been convicted by its message.

The above Bible verse is in reference to the chapters on the fourth purpose in Warren's book: *You Were Shaped for Serving God.* In those chapters we are told that we are each created with everything we need to accomplish the assignment God gives us, and those attributes are our SHAPE. Spiritual gifts – **Heart** – **A**bilities – **Personality** – **Experience**.

After much discussion on this concept, Warren says, "Your *primary* ministry should be in the area of your shape, but your *secondary* service is wherever you're needed at the moment." (p. 258). Then, on page 260 he says, "No task is beneath you when you have a servant's heart. ... Don't look for great tasks to do for God. Just do the not-so-great stuff, and God will assign you whatever he wants you to do."

You know what I thought of when I read these words? Bathroom cleanup at the walks! And fellowship and babysitting needs at Gatherings! We all would rather attend the Gathering than be in the room babysitting children. (Fortunately we now have paid babysitters and don't need to volunteer very often.) Fridays are busy and getting to the church early to set up the fellowship food can be a challenge. Cleaning our own bathrooms isn't very much fun, let alone multiple ones at camp!

We are at the time where we will be asked to volunteer our fourth day services at the Fall Walks. There is room for help in the prayer vigil, in serving the meals, in set-up and breakdown, and in cleaning the bathrooms! Please consider all of these areas when asked to help – pray for a servant's heart to help accomplish the work of our Community. Warren (on page 258) asks: How can you know if you have the heart of a servant? Jesus said, "You can tell what they are by what they do."

## Who Can Sponsor and How?

Anyone who has been a pilgrim on a Walk to Emmaus or other similar walks can sponsor another person. But how?

- □ Pray for the person's openness to God's call to discipleship, not for how to get him or her to go on a Walk.
- ☐ Make an appointment with the person or couple for the purpose of discussing participation in Emmaus.
- □ Extend an invitation Invite the prospective pilgrim to attend for the sake of a more vital relationship with Jesus Christ, not just an event to go to. Share your faith; explain the most basic elements of the Walk, its purpose, and follow up dimensions that help us live in grace for the rest of our lives. Take the attitude that you are giving the person a wonderful gift rather than that he or she needs to go.
- Ask the person to make a commitment by filling in the registration form. If the person is married, speak with both partners and encourage an equal commitment by both. Get help from a second sponsor if needed in sponsoring a couple. Continue to pray for your prospective pilgrim. Prepare agapes letter and enlist the support of their pastor. Collect apage letters. *Do not* ask the team to deliver personal gifts during the three days.
- □ Support the Walk through your prayers during the 72-hour prayer vigil and your presence at Send Off, Sponsors' Hour, Candlelight and Closing. Support the Pilgrim's family by house-sitting, baby-sitting, watering plants, picking up mail, feeding pets, or just checking in with a spouse to see if any help is needed.
- □ Encourage the Pilgrim in his or her Fourth Day involvement. Give your friend an opportunity to talk through and appreciate the experience. Help the Pilgrim find a Share Group, or be prepared to start a Share Group with him or her for a period of time until others join the Group. Take the Pilgrim to Gatherings as your guest for a couple of months.
- □ Help the Pilgrim re-enter his or her church. Discuss with your Pilgrim ways to serve the Emmaus Community & future Walks. Help the Pilgrim sponsor others.

Because of the importance of sponsorship, the second part of TRWE application is for the sponsor to complete. This act of love involves an investment of you in the life and welfare of another. Christ came for us all to share. Rolen Burnette Community ALD

### SEPTEMBER BOARD ELECTIONS

According to the Three Rivers Walk to Emmaus bylaws, at the Gathering on September 12, 2003 we are to have the election for the incoming Board of Directors who will begin their service in January. At prior Gatherings and in a newsflash you were informed that the slate of officers proposed by the current Board is: Scott Robinette, Linda Claypool, Glenn Brooks and Mary Sickles.

This slate will be placed before you for election in September. Should you choose to nominate others, you will have opportunity to do so. However, it is your responsibility to get prior approval from the person you wish to nominate. One thing to keep in mind is that the slate should reflect a balance represented in the Community – in areas of denomination, gender and congregation.

The Board meets monthly and each member serves for a three-year term. Please keep this in mind if choosing to nominate someone – and discuss this level of commitment with him/her – before placing a name before the Community.

The following amendments to the by-laws will be adopted at the September Gathering unless written objections by 25 community members are received. Changes are in caps.

REGARDING ELECTIONS TO THE BOARD: ARTICLE V SECTION C 1 Directors shall be elected by the Community to a three (3) year term WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE REGISTRATION COORDINATOR WHO WILL BE ELECTED TO A SIX (6) YEAR EX-OFFICIO TERM

ARTICLE VI (Team selection) SECTION L 3 The remaining members of the team shall be nominated by the Team Selection Committee and selected through prayer by the Lay Director for the weekend. The Team Selection Committee shall be comprised of the Community Lay Director, the Community Spiritual Director, THE REGISTRATION COORDINATOR the Lay Director and the Spiritual Director for the weekend, the Lay Director in Training, AND THREE OR FOUR OTHER MEMBERS OF THE EMMAUS COMMUNITY (NON-BOARD MEMBERS), and shall be chaired by the Assistant Community Lay Director. Men's and Women's team selection may be done jointly at the same meeting. Information of past team experience shall be provide by the Membership Secretary in advance.

Since we last went to press, TRWE has received a contribution to help defray the cost of Team Manuals. A contribution that was noted in the May Newsletter will support the cost of new songbooks, handbooks, and scholarships.



This day of learning will be led by the Northeastern Field Representative for the Walk to Emmaus, Bob Brandt. Bob has helped form more than 6 Emmaus communities and as the Northeastern Regional Field Representative for the international movement has responsibility for the 35 communities in the Northeast.

I am missing you all!! (I should say Ya'll) Things are good in Nashville despite occasional bouts of homesickness. I have been searching for a home church since I moved in March. It's difficult because much of my travel has been on the weekends so I am not in town every Sunday. Of the churches I have visited (4) I have not found them to be open and welcoming unless I have accompanied someone who attends there. Shortly after I moved here I was invited to give a 4th day talk at a candlelight for the Women's Walk at the community here in Nashville. When I entered the sanctuary not one person greeted me or introduced themselves to me. The person who had invited me was busy and asked me to take a seat toward the front so I could get up and come to the lectern when it was time. I thought it was pretty obvious that I was a visitor but the folks gathered there seemed only interested in the people they knew. No one welcomed the stranger. After my talk several people did say that they enjoyed it, etc., but no one really introduced themselves nor did they invite me to their gatherings! The intent of this note to you is to remind you to be sure to welcome the new people at gathering - take

them under your wing - make them feel welcome and be sure to invite them back! I am urging you to "Keep on loving each other as brothers (and sisters) Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by doing so some people have entertained angels without knowing it." Hebrews 13:1-2 Those of you who know me know that I am not an ANGEL! But I am a child of God, a sister in Christ, and should feel welcomed by the community of saints (and sinners) as should anyone who attends an Emmaus gathering. Greetings TRWE, My name is Linda Porter, TRWE #8, Table of ELIZABETH!

I send you salutations from the Land of the Tsars! Many of you know that for the past 8 years I have done many mission trips to the Arctic Circle of Russia, to the Republic of Komi. It has been the joy of my life to serve Jesus in this manner. This year for the first time since 1995 we have had to cancel our mission trips because of the political climate in Russia. But the Lord always has "Plan B" waiting in the wings. This past year has brought about lots of changes in my life and I would like to share one of them with you. In April a pastor friend came to me and showed me some pictures of a city in Europe from which he had just returned. He told me about the people, the spiritual condition of the area, and the physical needs. My heart began to pound in my chest! Then he asked me if I would like to go there to be an assistant pastor in one of the churches, as the pastor there is terribly over-burdened and needs are growing daily.

My spirit just SOARED into the heavenlies. I knew INSTANTLY that the Lord was speaking to me and that he was opening this door in ministry for me. The city is Kamenyets-Podolsky in the nation of Ukraine. This was in April. This gave me eight weeks to prepare for a life move, to get all the necessary papers in order, to sell all my earthly possessions, to come up with funding for 6 months, plus plane fare, health insurance, and a myriad of other details. And by God's Perfect Grace, it happened!! Even as I sit here writing this, I can't believe it has really taken place. One obstacle after another was just moved aside by the hand of the Lord. The unemployment rate is 40% and all of the problems that go along with that abound.

I am planning to come back to the states next summer for 3 months and would love to talk with any of your groups or at a Gathering about the mission. #### **DIRECTIONS TO DUTILH UMC**

**From the South** Route 79 or I-279, take the Cranberry exit. This will put you on Route 19. Stay on Route 19 for about a mile (second light past Bob Evans) to St. Francis Way, opposite the entrance to Cranberry Mall. Turn right on St. Francis to the first STOP sign (about 100 yards) and then turn right again at the stop sign. A motel is the first driveway. At the first stop light, turn right on St. Francis Way (about 100 yards) and then turn right again at the stop sign. A motel is the first driveway on the right. The Church is the second driveway.
