Love Notes from Linda

Faults are thick where love is thin

"And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins." 1 Peter 4:8

The "thing" about the Emmaus Community which attracted me was the community's ability to love one another; to serve sacrificially; and to support one another through life's trials helping one another discern God's will individually and corporately. Love defines who we are, and yet I still see fringes where love seeps out and unkind thoughts and actions seep in. Perhaps a reminder will be helpful.

A Lenten Bible Study "Loving the Jesus Way" talks a lot about kindnesses and charity; about growing spiritually so that loving isn't an effort, but rather a response. Easier said than done! However, when love is not our priority, our main objective in every relationship and situation, we do tend to see the worst rather than the best

We need to truly learn to pray for our enemies; for those that hurt us and our loved ones. We need to learn to let go of our anger and disappointments and focus on how our love can not only help to change another, but how it also <u>will change us</u>.

In our community, we must ever be vigilant that we do not become power hungry and lime-light seekers; but rather to remember always that we are SERVANT! It's not about power or control; in fact it's not about US – it's about God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit and how we can reflect who we are in THEM.

Every one of us has faults – too many to count, but when we stand before our Savior on judgment day, each of us wants Jesus to overlook those faults and to pour out his love, mercy and grace upon us. Therefore, we need to practice that wonderful scripture: (Matthew 7:12 and Luke 6:31 "Treat others as you would like to be treated." How many of us would respond, "Point out all of my faults and chastise me daily!" Rather would we not say, "In spite of all that is wrong with me, love me and show me mercy."

Our responsibility then is to learn to let go, let God, and love as if there is no tomorrow. This means that we love responsibly – that if we have a need to share how we have been hurt by another's actions, we do it with grace, being sure that we own the hurt. Often we will find that what hurt us was unintentional on the part of the one who hurt us. If we spend time fault counting, love may pass us by, and more importantly, an opportunity to express love may be missed. Faulty, but seeking mercy and grace, I am,

How can I Help on a Walk?

- 1. Prayer Vigil: this you can do right from your own home and it doesn't cost anything but your time. If you are computer savvy, go the Emmaus Website, connect to the appropriate link and sign up your name in the appropriate time slot. If you do not have a computer or do not know how to use one, you can sign up at our gatherings.
- 2. Serve A Meal: Once again, go to the Website and go to the appropriate link, or sign up at gatherings, there is always good food and clipboards there.
- 3. Bathroom Angels: I'm not too crazy about this one either, but bring an Emmaus buddy with you and the work goes faster.
- 4. Sunday Angels: This one is a big help for those who have been at camp all weekend. By Sunday afternoon, those who have been on team will have a smile on their face and much appreciation for the help you will provide to tear down and pack up the camp.

Well, there you go; 1, 2, 3, 4. Pick one of these numbers, call up your reunion group or an Emmaus buddy; ask them to sign up to serve.

PS: I also encourage you to go to closing, even if you are not sponsoring anyone; it never fails to be a "revival" service; with much singing from the heart, rededications from those who have pulled away from God; and the participation in a very special Communion.

To see the pilgrims stand up together as one group, table by table, and tell of how the weekend has touched their lives is a reminder of why there is an Emmaus retreat.

We also made a bold decision about the actual flights. We are moving **BOTH** the BOYS Flight and the GIRLS Flight to the week-end prior to Martin Luther King's Birthday Holiday in January, 2008. The Flights will both be **SATURDAY**, **JANUARY 19**, **SUNDAY**, **JANUARY 20 AND MONDAY**, **JANUARY 21**, **2008**.

The public schools are all closed for Martin Luther King's birthday that Monday. If for any reason the teen you sponsor's school is not closed that Monday; they are afforded a religious holiday day by attending Chrysalis; they must simply request it off in an excuse from their parents.

Our plan is to hold the one week-end event at the NEW Family Resource Camp (which was the old Fresh Air Camp). They have demolished most of the buildings, and built brand new cabins, conference rooms, and currently have two dining halls. The BOYS and the GIRLS will have separate conference rooms, separate dining times, separate breaks, separate candlelights, and separate closings.

We ask for your involvement to help this ministry. We need everyone to do something to help this ministry. Please pray about what you can do. Please choose to sponsor, make agape, pray for this ministry, serve on team, serve as fourth day, attend candlelight (it will be two in one night!!) Help us to reach out to this generation with the AGAPE LOVE of Jesus Christ and to spread the gospel to all.


