FROM THE COMMUNITY SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

Lest I forget to share this note with you, I'd like to reflect on three events, one just past and two in the near future.

On March 9, we had an all community gathering at Ingomar UMC; we used the Sanctuary and were blessed by how much it added to our service. During this gathering, we worshipped as a body and glorified the Lord Jesus Christ. We shared in the Word, we remembered our fellow pilgrims who now sing before the Lord, (See names on page 8) we commissioned our teams for walks 81 and 82 and we broke the bread and shared the cup. Truly, Christ was re-presented in power and love. There are so many people responsible for this time of worship . . . yet truth be told, it was God's time and to God be all the glory. So I want to add my thanks to the community which made this all possible. We are now in the season of Lent – and (don't anticipate) that is preparation for the great celebration of Easter. THE SOLE PURPOSE

One of the things I would like to do in my new position as Outreach Coordinator for the E-board, is to not only share the message of Emmaus with the outside world, but also with the community. I believe that we must better understand the hows and whys of our community.

If I asked you what the purpose of Emmaus is, I am sure I would get a lot of interesting answers. A closer walk with God, a mountaintop experience, learning more about Christianity would be some of the responses. All wonderful reasons but none is really the purpose of this movement. Let me share with you something from the Emmaus handbook, Chapter 15:

The <u>sole purpose</u> of the Emmaus Movement is to strengthen disciples within the ministry of individual congregations. Emmaus is in partnership with the church to inspire its leaders to become more effective and intentional in their ministry. Emmaus is neither competitive with nor a substitute for your own church.

Although The Walk to Emmaus is a unique and powerful instrument through which faithful people are renewed and inspired, it cannot provide the well-rounded programs such as education, evangelism, missions, and stewardship that are provided by an individual congregation. In short, Emmaus does not intend to become anyone's "new church." However, Emmaus does have a unique role in the life and ministry of the church in the church's task of nurturing strong committed disciples compassionately serving Christ in the world. The unique role of the Walk to Emmaus is spiritual renewal.

The benefit of the Emmaus Movement can be maximized and the problems minimized by staying focused on its purpose in relation to the church. Emmaus pilgrims who are eager for spiritual growth sometimes ask, "What's next after Emmaus?" The best and truest answer is, "Your church!" Emmaus is not simply another in a series of retreats for individuals. Rather, Emmaus is meant to be a means by which Christians reclaim their Christian heritage with enthusiasm and return to their churches with new vision and commitment. Emmaus comes from the church and Emmaus returns to the church. What follows is a potpourri of images, ideas, and suggestions for making the most of the relationship between Emmaus and the church.

The "sole purpose" language focuses in on the primary reason for the Walk's existence. Just as the "Ten Commandments" are not the "ten suggestions", our purpose is clear. Strengthening of the church is the foundation of the movement. When we sponsor, we should be able to articulate the purpose of the Walk to Emmaus.

We need not exclude the other parts of the experience from our invitation, but we must not overlook the foundation.

As a pastor I have seen great and positive changes in people that have come back to the congregation. Church renewal will change not only our congregations but our very world. Board positions part 2

The **Community Fellowship Coordinator** recruits laity and clergy for participation in the Community worship life. This includes Fourth Day speakers, clergy, and hosts for fellowship time for Gatherings. The CF/GC also coordinates the Communion set-up (including elements). Bryan Pass

The Community Fourth Day Coordinator encourages community members to grow in their relationship with Christ through volunteer service that provides support, guidance and challenge. The CFDC prepares the sign-up sheets, listing the jobs and the number of Fourth Day Weekend workers needed and oversees the signups for the Prayer Vigil and prepares the Prayer Vigil Posters. Mike Varner

The **Community Kitchen Coordinator** is responsible for food service operations for the weekend and other community functions. The CKC helps to plan the menus for the weekends, including the Hearty Snack on Sunday. The CKC also informs the kitchen personnel of any food allergies or special diet restrictions of the team or pilgrims. Rev. Cindy Parker

The Community Literature Coordinator is responsible for maintaining the Team manuals. It is also the CLC's responsibility to see that the manuals are given to the Lay Directors in a timely manner before teaming. The manuals are to be checked for damage, missing pages, or errors between walks. As directed by the board, the CLC will make purchases from The Upper Room. Wes Kindelberger

The **Community Music Coordinator** coordinates our music life by seeing that the songbooks get to all functions and is responsible for obtaining the weekend music directors. The CMC coordinates with the

Fellowship Coordinator for all Gatherings. The CMC stores all songbooks, Master Song Music Books and sound system when not in use. Ron Hujik

The **Community Outreach Coordinator** is responsible for coordinating the publicity (brochures, letters to the churches, etc.) of Emmaus in other ecumenical settings, coordinating the fund-raising activities of the Community and providing an Emmaus display and literature for a table at Annual Conference. Rev. Ernie De Luca

The Community Purchasing Coordinator purchases, maintains inventory and distributes as needed all Walk supplies (Conference Room, chapels, first aid, All Nashville Upper Room Emmaus items, any items suggested by the Lay Directors of the Walks, and small items for cabins. The CPC also contacts a photographer for the group picture. Gary Pennington

The **Community Registration Coordinator** maintains membership records of all participants in any Emmaus activity and makes this information available to the Team Selection Committee. The CRC also oversees the process of receiving applications and fees, confirms the reservations by written notice, and notifies the CSD of any scholarship requests. The CRC furnishes Pilgrim information to the Lay Directors of the Walks. Bill Wiegand

The Community Reunion Coordinator maintains a current record of all reunion croups and encourages pilgrims to become connected through a reunion group. The CRC also assists people form Reunion Groups. Rev. Jim Markley

The Webmaster Although not a board member, the Webmaster keeps our website (<u>www.trwe.org</u>) current. The webmaster also sets up the pages for Fourth Day help (dining room servers, bathroom cleaners, Emmaus angels, and the Prayer Vigil) for the Walks. Mike Wild
