A Lenten Treasure

Lent. We are in the midst of this beautiful and holy season the church calls Lent. What comes to your mind when you hear the word Lent? Fasting? Praying? Which church has the best fish fry? The need to give something up or do without?

At Christ Church, we began the season of Lent with a candle meditation. The worship team recycled purple advent candles and placed them in a circle around a crown of thorns, one for each Sunday in Lent. In the middle of the crown, they placed the white Christ candle. Unlike Advent, all of the candles were lit on the first Sunday in Lent, and will be extinguished weekly as we remember the darkness of Jesus' journey to the cross and acknowledge the pain of sin in the world.

We do not do this to be morbid. We do this because in the story of Jesus' death and resurrection - God is revealed! In the amazing transformation of death into life, in endings transformed into beginnings, and in dead-ends that become the source for new possibilities!

This is the sacred center of our faith that Jesus Christ brought to light. God is in each and every one of us-through the gift of the Holy Spirit-transforming us and transforming the world!

Through his pain and suffering, Jesus speaks to every pain, each loss you have endured and He offers you the promise of transformation.

You are a Lenten treasure-God's Lenten treasure!

Gifts of *Agape* are always needed for the Walks; so take a moment and think back to what you really enjoyed receiving during your Walk. Was it a piece of candy attached to a Bible verse? Was it a trinket of some sort that had a catchy phrase attached? Or was it something that could actually be used during your Walk (i.e., pens, pencils, flashlight, or water bottle).

Quick, while you are reminiscing, sit down. Put your thinking cap on. And use the left side of your brain (that is the creative side, right?) to come up with a gift of *Agape* for the upcoming Walks #89 and #90. If you can't think of anything yourself, you may want to search Google.com for "Gifts of *Agape* ideas". There are a multitude of resources available on the internet ...one of my favorite is www.niemmaus.com/agape which is a link to Northern Indiana Emmaus Community's list of 101 Agape Ideas.

Okay, let's assume you now have an idea for *Agape*. If you want to make *Agape* for just the Pilgrims, please make 14 (men) 19 (women). To include Inside Team, please add 23, and to include those serving on Outside Team, please add 12. But don't forget to multiply the number by two (2) if you want to provide your Agape for both the Men's and the Women's Walks.

Once you have completed your Gifts of *Agape*, the *Agape* should be taken to the Camp on either Thursday or Friday of the Walk so that the Walk's *Agape* Coordinator can plan accordingly. And if you wish to have your gift of *Agape* given on a specific day and/or time, please mark that on your box (or bag). Any leftover *Agape* can be picked up on Sunday afternoon before (or after) Closing.

Ready ... Set ... Go. It's time to pay it forward.

DIRECTIONS TO FAMILY RETREAT CENTER

1100 Freeport Road, Cranberry, PA

From Pittsburgh Take Route I-279 North to Route 79 North. Take Exit 76 (Cranberry, US 19—a left-hand exit). Your exit ramp will merge into Route 19 North. Stay in the right-hand turning lane; turn right at the first traffic light, onto Freeport Road. The intersection is marked by a Sunoco station and a Fifth Third Bank. ** See below for further directions.

From Pennsylvania Turnpike (*Points East/West*) Take the Turnpike to Exit 28 (Cranberry). Take US Route 19 South. Move into the left-hand lane as soon as possible. At the first traffic light on Route 19, turn left. Count three more traffic lights and turn left onto Freeport Road. The intersection is marked by a Sunoco station and a Fifth Third Bank. ** See below for further directions.

From Erie (*Points North*) Take Route 77 South to Exit 78 (Cranberry, US 19). At the end of the ramp, turn right onto Route 228. Move into the left-hand lane as soon as possible. At the first traffic light on Route 19, turn left. Count three more traffic lights and turn left onto Freeport Road. The intersection is marked by a Sunoco station and a Fifth Third Bank. ** See below for further directions.

**The Family Retreat Center is approximately one half mile from the intersection of Route 19 and Freeport Road. Take Freeport Road over the bridge, passing the Regional Learning Alliance on the left, and continue another 300 yards. Slow down—the Retreat Center entrance is on the left, partly concealed by trees. Enter through the black gate and the first set of stone pillars.
