- 3) Not all of the people will be happy all of the time, no matter how hard one tries because we all have an expectation as to how the weekend should occur. Therefore, the Board is moving back to closely following the Model. It's tried and proven to work, so we are faithfully trying to follow its example. We signed a covenant to follow the Model.
- 4) We need to be people who think of how we can encourage and lift up rather than discourage and tear down. I have many fears and going somewhere without my watch and cell phone, well I was not sure if I could breath without my phone. I am a control freak, I am getting better at the control thing, still I was not sure about this whole Walk to Emmaus *no anticipation*- let it just happen thing. Where was my sponsor taking me? No clue. How long to get there? No clue. Was it a primitive camp or a nice college like setting? No clue. Don't *anticipate* was always staring at me. If you don't *anticipate* you will not be disappointed. *Problem was* <u>- I was the mother of anticipation</u>. I am Mrs. Gravits from Bewitched. I was so worried about where I was going to sleep, what I was going to eat, were they going to leave me in the woods at night to find and trust God? Man, the fears went on and on.

Then I thought of my Sponsor Sandy. She had changed over the years since I first met her, she was very shy and it took a lot to get her to talk, now she had kind of a peaceful glow about her a self assurance, I really kinda envied. All the Emmaus walkers from my church had this peace. I wanted that peace in the worst way.

What a gift my walk was. People that love the Lord where everywhere. They served you, gave you agape that never ended, even days after you were home. The Lord serves us with his grace, full of love, that was something that I became fully aware of. The world is discouraging sometimes, but in my fourth day (s) I am more at peace with the knowledge that it is okay, just do your best to serve, share God's love and maybe you might show someone else that peace. The atmosphere at Emmaus takes all the discouragement in the world away. My description when people ask me, how was your religious walk to wherever you went?- I respond with, how do you think 72 hours with God would be? ⁽²⁾ I say - Incredible, can't really describe it to you, sorry, no anticipation, just in case you ever have the calling to go! ③ My fourth day was (is) very emotional I love my family, but when I saw them, I was overwhelmed with the love I had taken for granted for all these years. I could not wait to serve them, and serve them with a want in my heart not a task theology. I go into the grocery store and since I have not stopped smiling at this point, I want to grab people by the arms look into their eyes and say Jesus loves you.... Really loves you, - it is not about you it is about him! But as hard as it is I refrain because I could get arrested for the amount of joy I have. Yeah and then true life hits.... The tragedy of family sickness, the stress of balancing everything, and this unbelievable urge to basically do very little and study scripture has me juggling again. I have become more faithful with my studying; I get more out of it. To know me is to know that I am a doer, the more stuff I do the more I enjoy life. I am involved in a lot at my church. I have always done it to thank the Lord for all my many blessings. I feel compelled to continue and maybe switch roles a little bit, we'll see.

I do seem a bit lonelier now, I guess once my husband goes on the walk we can share. I yearn to speak to God a lot more. I look at everything thru DeColores eyes. And I realize wow God is an awesome God and I thank him for everything. I thank all who served me on my walk. I want to give back to the Emmaus community so that someone else will say – How would you expect 72 hours with God to be?

A word from The Next Flight Lay Directors.....

How often do you get a real opportunity to make a difference? Do you remember the 'Changing Our World' talk from your walk? Have you finished changing or at least improving yourself?, your family?, your street?, or further?

You can sponsor a teen for the upcoming Chrysalis flights and let Chrysalis teach them about making new faith commitments. They will be inspired, challenged, and equipped to have a closer relationship, perhaps even a friendship, with Jesus.

Here's what you should tell a teen about Chrysalis:

You'll spend three days with other people your age in worship, prayer, fellowship, creative expression, recreation, singing, and discussion. You'll experience the love of God through prayers and acts of service from a loving support community.

You'll hear talks, given by youth, and adults, which focus on the needs of maturing youth, offer the message of the gospel and the friendship and example of Jesus Christ. Each day you'll hear five talks, followed by discussion, reflection, and expression of how these messages can encourage your personal faith. The discussions explore how friendship with Jesus can help you live out your faith with family, friends, and other people in your world.

Any teen who has completed the ninth grade is eligible. Can you think of one who needs to hear about God's unconditional love? Print out an application from the web site - <u>www.trwe.org</u> and talk to them about the best three days of their life.

Speaking for our team, (both inside and outside), for the Corrections Officers and officials of the prison, and especially for the 30 residents chosen to attend, we thank you for your prayers and your letters of support.

Fourth Day Corner...


