# **Training Opportunities**

The following training events are available either via WebEx or at a Leadership Training Event. Any one of these opportunities meets the Clergy Criteria Training required for all that are serving as Community Spiritual Directors and Weekend Spiritual Directors. They are also highly recommended for those who would be considered in these roles in the future, for those who may need a refresher, and for any laity who may want to know about the roles and responsibilities of the community and weekend clergy and the theology presented on the events. Community Board Members and future Weekend Lay Directors have found this training to be very helpful as well.

(0.4) CEUs are offered to clergy for the 4-hour WebEx sessions and (0.6) CEUs are offered for the all day Leadership Development Events that include the 4 hour Clergy Training and the Clergy/Laity Partnership session.

## Couldn't have done it without you --

I'm sure you have heard this expression before. Maybe someone expressed gratitude to you for helping out in some endeavor. Perhaps you said it yourself to someone who was a big part of something you did.

There are some obvious things that occur that make Three Rivers Walk to Emmaus a vibrant part of people's lives; things that couldn't happen without our community getting involved. Obviously, without pilgrims there would be no walks. So sponsors – thank you; we couldn't have done it without you.

People being on team are another. So team members – thank you for saying yes to God's call; we couldn't have done it without you.

The 4th day folks -- those who pray for our walks, provide agape, those "angels" who clean our bathrooms, who come to candlelight, and others who help anonymously – while a weekend could happen without these precious people, I shudder to think what the outcome of a weekend would be without you. And we do truly thank you.

There is other work in Three Rivers Walk to Emmaus that is important for the community to function as it should, another way for you to get involved – that is as a member of the Board of Directors. As our bylaws state, the "direction of the community shall be vested in the Board of Directors having general oversight in all matters relating to the community following the guidelines of The Upper Room......the powers, property, and affairs of the community...shall be exercised, controlled and conducted by the Board of Directors."

Without a Board of Directors, there is no 4th day help, no team and no pilgrims. There would simply be no Three Rivers Walk to Emmaus. This is the time of year where the board is seeking five members to replace those whose terms will expire at the end of this year. sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.

Recently the Pittsburgh Post- Gazette carried a story about a family in Latrobe, PA, and their dog, Boone, the boxer. Boone has a "doggie door" that enables him to enter and exit the house without supervision. Unfortunately, this door can be used by other animals as well—animals like skunks.

The Grays were not at home the night an uninvited skunk came in through the doggy door. A few hours later when the family returned, Boone and the skunk were still at it. Mr. Gray managed to corner the skunk in a bedroom and have it removed by the Pennsylvania Game Commission.

Experts were called in to tell the Grays how they might restore their home to pre-fight conditions.

What the experts said was this: get rid of your clothes; toss your furniture; tear the sheet rock off its studs, and begin over. The insurance company agreed that doing those things would be the way for the Gray family to proceed. Oh, the insurance company also said something else, something like "While we feel sorry for you, and deeply regret what has happened to your home, you should know your homeowner's policy does not cover your domicile for damages done by skunks that gained entrance through a doggy door left open."

As this devotion is written, the Grays have shelled out \$70,000 and they estimate they will spend another \$50,000 before they are done reclaiming their home.

Now there ought to be a devotional point to this sad story -- and there is. The point is we need to watch what comes into the homes of our hearts.

James talks about the process of how a sin begins in a simple way. It all starts when a heart which ought to be owned by the Lord has been built with a doggy door. It doesn't take too long Members serve for three years. The Board usually meets on the first Saturday of each month (you get July off!).

Another way to serve is to assist the board by helping out when needed for specific tasks such as making phone calls, sending emails or working with a board member on a particular project.
